Travelling with Catherine Mackler







Welcome back to the beginning of a new year of Western Sussex AAUW membership. Your Board has met several times over the summer to plan for this year. During our first meeting on September 27th, we will ask you to vote on the budget that Ellen has put together for us. A copy is in this newsletter for your review. In addition to our September program, we have also planned our November and January programs and are working on our March and May programs. If you have any ideas or would like to be involved in the program planning please contact Gerry or Shirley.

Those of you who attended our May meeting had the opportunity to meet this year's recipient of our high school scholarship. During our September meeting you will meet our Delaware Aerospace Academy Summer Camp scholarship recipient. Unfortunately, we have not had any applicants for our DTCC Women's Continuing Education Scholarship, in spite of all of the work that Jean and Gerry did last year to promote the scholarship. Jean is once again meeting with staff at DTCC to find other ways of promoting this scholarship. This fall, Lisa will be heading up a committee to review and revise our high school scholarship criteria and application. If you would like to take part in this, please let Lisa know.

Each year, our scholarship offerings are slightly over our annual fundraising for the scholarship fund. This has not been a problem so far because there have been several years that we have not awarded the \$1000 DTCC scholarship due to a lack of applicants. However, the Board feels that there is a need to maintain a balanced budget without carrying funds over from the prior year. As you know, we have had a raffle each fall to raise money for our operating funds. This has been necessary because our dues earnings of \$5 per member (approximately \$150 total) do not cover our operating expenses. Currently, the dues for other Delaware branches are: Middletown \$5, Coastal Georgetown, Newark and Wilmington \$10, and Dover \$20. We would like you to consider the need to raise our branch dues to cover our operating expenses thus leaving our fundraisers to completely support our scholarship offerings. Of course, this will be subject to a vote and if passed, would not take effect until next year.

Lastly, there are opportunities for branch members to serve on the state board and committees. Help is needed in the area of public policy, programs and bylaws.
