What's Happening in Our Town

Our January meeting was very informative as Trisha Newcomer, Director of Economic Development and Community Relations for the City of Seaford, came and spoke to us about all the great changes and improvements happening around Seaford.

Trisha talked in depth about the Downtown Development Grant, given to the city in 2005. It's being used to help owners of the downtown area recoup around 20% of their initial investment. This also helps the city to entice businesses and investors to our downtown. To date, over 1.2 million dollars in grants have been given by the state.

Additional improvements to the city are also in the works. The Royal Farms was totally refurbished and expanded to offer more to the downtown area. A project is currently underway to revamp the Triangle Park and the immediate area. The Oyster House Project by the river will offer a restaurant, ties to the Seaford Museum, and beautification of the river walk area. The city has been working diligently with The Chesapeake Conservancy. There is also additional investigation of a possible connection to the National Park Services.

Continued interest in the redevelopment of the Nylon Capital Shopping Center as well as attracting and bringing in new business remains at the front of city's desire to grow and build a thriving community. The McDonald's on Rt 13 is currently under new construction, and a Chik-Fil-A is coming to the old Wendy's site by the Food Lion.

A Rental-to-Home Ownership project is currently helping renters with taxes associated with home ownership. By helping renters navigate the costly process of buying a home, the city is encouraging them to put down roots and become a part of the city.

It was encouraging to hear all the great things going on in our city.




